40-50 - Advanced (3rd year)

**60 – Topics in Culture and Linguistics** (4<sup>th</sup> year & beyond)

**70** – Introductory survey or panorama – overviews of periods and topics within a tradition

**80** – Focus on performance or practice (theater, translation)

**200** – Seminar on a particular topic, primarily for graduate students but open to advanced undergraduates **with permission of instructor**
